The second change was a belief in Bodhisattvas. I saw this article two months before prelims and I started applying the techniques in the mock tests I did after that, and also tried solving previous upsc papers using the same. But I could get some of the difficult questions by elimination techniques. My score is coming around 110-120 based on various keys compared to 74 marks for prelims 2018.
